Will continue vocal music, but will focus on MN standards for arts/music-Create-compose music/rhythm. Perform-rehearse and share with audience. Respond-learn musical language and apply it to songs/pieces of music and compare pieces of music. Connect-students connect their own feelings to music they hear, as well as cultural connections. In class students will play instruments, sing, listen and respond to music and share with each other. Choral concert will be in February, a musical will be in May-she would love to have parent input and support with the musical! Principal's Report HMS School Discipline Plan & PBIS New Band Teacher - Keith Liuzzi - supported by PTA	School choice fair will return and will take place in December to compete with private/charter schools-12/10/22 and volunteers are needed to help share experience at Horace Mann School discipline policy focuses on proactive teaching, modeling, practice of schoolwide expectations and teaching rituals and routines. The school believes that students do what they can, and if they are struggling they haven't yet developed the skills necessary for success. Common language across the school so that students can receive redirection/instruction/positive reinforcement from any teacher using common language. Monthly assembly focuses on 1 skill (e.g self-control) Counselor teaches to every classroom-different proactive social strategies. Schoolwide teams to develop positive behavior supports and interventions for students who are struggling. Staff are trained to recognize mental health concerns, trauma informed training. Feels that students are entering with higher levels of anxiety, but this year seems to be better than the previous year. More consistency with scheduling, students not having to quarantine, lower adult stress about pandemic seems to be helping decrease student
	anxiety. School discipline plan aligns with SPPS student handbook.

	New band teacher is a grandparent of HMS student. It is provided after school (EDL) by SPPS, and one day per week during the school day by the PTA. This allows students to participate who could not do EDL, as well as provides the opportunity for ensemble practice. The plan is the have a spring % concert.
	Fieldtrips-school board recently passed additional requirements (background checks for any chaperones, chaperones signing mandated reporter statement, etc) School pays for background checks.
Teacher Updates Teacher Convention Read-a-thon Nov Conferences - What to Expect/Tips for Parents	Mark-Previously taught ELL, is Reading Recovery trained. Currently teaching WINN (What I Need Now). Reading, writing. Focusing back on phonemic awareness/phonics and decoding for student who are struggling. May have students coming home with decodeable books so that strong readers also become strong decoders. Currently he is seeing about 48 students per day in reading groups (11-12 groups/day). Mostly working with students who are struggling, but will also instruct students who are just needing a little boost. TEacher convention is Thursday/Friday which is a chance for professional development, but SPPS provides this so many teachers may not be in attendance. Read-a-Thon starting soon-working to build it back up. A packet will come home.
