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 The tree project is being led by a district consultant. There are no updated at the moment. They aerated the field and they will not be seeding it. They would have to fence off the area and not let the kids play on it. Budget engagement sessions. has anyone been to one? have they indicated if there will be a feedback loop? There is a meeting this Friday with the chief of schools just to inform the principals and staff. Nothing directed towards the families. The district will likely send out the summarized results of the engagement sessions.
 How does the school use that results data of the MCA tests? <u>Principal PTA Presentations - Google Slides</u> MCAs are not hugely helpful for educators - this is last year's data. They look at the start of the year to see what trends are for the last several years. How do we do compare to St. Paul and the state. Also look at it by student groups and EL students. EL students also take an additional test to the MCAs. Speaking portion is done one on one. The data does help to identify trends and if there are certain groups within the school population that are behind for targeted interventions. Pr. Litwin question for PTA-protest went by – (Pro-Palestine protest of St. Kates students, and Jewish families were concerned about that happening) Did receive a response from St. Catherines.

(non-Jewish family) Try to focus on taking different perspectives Difficult to know what to discuss at school and what to leave to discuss with your families
